**FAIRPORT HARBOR PUBLIC LIBRARY PRESENTS
IMAGES OF AMERICA: AROUND JEFFERSON AND ROAMING SHORES
A CASUAL CONVERSATION WITH SANDY PAVICK**

As part of its ongoing Casual Conversations series, The Fairport Harbor Public Library will host a talk by local author Sandy Pavick. She will discuss her new book, *Images of America: Around Jefferson and Roaming Shores* (Arcadia Publishing, 2026). Afterwards she will take questions from the audience and sign copies of the book, which will be available for sale.

Sandy Pavick has lived in Northeast Ohio for more than 25 years and has been a full-time writer, blogger, editor and author for over 20 years. A self-professed history buff, Pavick has penned two previous titles focusing on Cleveland's Little Italy and Slavic Village neighborhoods, as well as *Historic Churches of Ashtabula County* and last year's *Painesville*. All are published by Arcadia Publishing, a leading publisher of regional and local history books in pictorial form. *Images of America: Around Jefferson and Roaming Shores* chronicles the history of Ashtabula County's county seat from 1800 to the present, plus the history of nearby Rock Creek and Roaming Shores. The heavily illustrated book contains more than 120 historic images from more than a dozen sources. A prolific author, Pavick is currently working on her sixth book which is about the history of Clarion, Pennsylvania.

Pavick lives in the woods, outside of Geneva, Ohio, with her husband, two rescue cats and rescue chow, Katie. When she's not writing, she can be found hiking in the woods, digging in the garden, organizing a craft show or scouring local antique stores for cast iron pans. She is also active in the Ashtabula County Church Community and maintains a Substack page called "A Writer's Life is Never Boring."
